

Drop-off Procedure

If your child takes the bus:

- In the morning, the bus will collect your child at the allocated time as indicated by STS.
- You must take your child to the meeting point and wait with them until they are on the bus.
- Please contact the bus nanny if your child is unwell to attend school due to illness.

If you drop your child at school:

- Entrance to the school begins at 7:30am.
- The drop off point for EYFS will be the external classroom glass doors leading to the outdoor classroom. Signage will direct you to the allocated door for your child's class. Please do follow the one-way system.
- Please allow extra time at the start of the school year to accommodate road works and increased traffic. Your children don't like to be late for school.

























Collection Procedure

If your child takes the bus:

- Your child will be taken to the bus by an adult.
- You must be at the collection point to meet your child at the allocated time.

If you pick your child up from school:

- The collection point for EYFS will be the outside external classroom glass door. The children will
 exit from the glass outside door. Signage will direct you to the allocated door for your child's
 class. Please do follow the one-way system.
- Please ensure the adult collecting your child has the 'safe word' (you will receive this in an email from your class teacher on Thursday 25th August). This will be requested upon collection until you become known to your child's class teacher. This is the same if you send someone on your behalf to collect your child. Let the teacher know in advance too.

























Thank you for being on time



- After the National Anthem the doors close at 7.50am. Anyone arriving after this time will be marked as late. In the unlikely case that you are late please head to main reception. Your child will be scanned in by a member of our admin team. Children don't like being late and we appreciate your support to ensure they are on time.
- Once school and learning has started, <u>parents are not able</u> to enter the corridors or classes.
- As per our GCS Behaviour Policy, punctuality is very important therefore if your child is late on 3 occasions throughout the term a member of the Senior Leadership Team will be in contact with you.


Attendance and Punctuality procedure-Afternoon

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




Snack & Lunch



- We are a healthy school and encourage healthy food to be consumed.
- Students should bring 1 small healthy snack e.g. a piece of fruit, some vegetables or a yoghurt.
- In their lunchbox they should have a variety of healthy foods from the different food groups e.g. a sandwich/chapati/wrap/rice, yoghurt/lebneh, dried fruits, cheese sticks or fresh fruit and veg.
- Please note no chocolate, nuts (due to allergies), sweets or fizzy drinks please.
- Children will not be allowed to share food.



























Supporting your child at home

- Please read with your child every day in both your home language and English!
- Revisit learning from the week as guided by your child's class teacher refer to the home learning grid sent on the weekly email every Thursday.
- Real life experiences take children shopping and get them to pay using money, bake a
 cake allowing your child to measure the ingredients etc.
- Play board games, don't forget to teach your child about how to lose. They can't always be the winner at school!
- Teach your child to be independent by encouraging getting them get dressed independently, to help with household chores and being responsible for their belongings.

Sounds of the Week: Recap of Phase 3 sounds
Tricky Word of the Week: All of Phase 3

By the end of Phase 3, children should be able to recognise and identify each sound, as well as saying a sound for each grapheme. We are working with children to build up their fluency when reading words and sentences containing Phase 2 and 3 sounds. It is important that children can recognise and identify different sounds in a word in order for them to segment and blend.

<u>Bug Club:</u> Books will still be allocated for your children every week, please take advantage of this platform to practice blending and segmenting!

Class Dojo

What is Class Dojo?

ClassDojo is a simple **collaboration app** for teachers and parents.

What does this mean for you and your child?

Your child's teacher will provide you with pictures, videos and important information (dates, visits, notices) on a daily/weekly basis. The pictures and videos shared could be in group form or individual.

How can you get involved as a parent?

On your homepage you have the option to upload what your child is doing at home. This could be learning, days out or special events in your family. The teacher will add this on to your child's individual portfolio.

How GCS supports our parents

- Every Thursday afternoon, parents will receive a weekly email with information on what curriculum content has been covered and what your child will cover the following week.
- We would expect a minimum expectation of 20 minutes of reading per day.
- Every Tuesday afternoon there will be an opportunity for parents to meet virtually with their Class Teacher. This is an opportunity to discuss any concerns or ask any questions you may have. A Zoom link will be sent out to you each week.
- Our priority is the teaching and learning of your child however we will respond to your email within 24 hours. If your communication is urgent, please contact our reception team by telephone and they will be able to pass on the message.
