#### To manage exam stress

- Work in 20 minute bursts, 10 minutes breaks psychologically proven
- Nutrition and rest is important
- Speak to teachers about anything unsure of
- Monitor progress and areas struggling on these should be the focus.
- Positive reinforcement important
- Don't expect 9's straight away this is unrealistic!
- Use revision guides and textbooks.

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
