# Drop-off Procedure

## If your child takes the bus:

- In the morning, the bus will collect your child at the allocated time as indicated by STS.
- You must take your child to the meeting point and wait with them until they are on the bus.
- Please contact the bus nanny if your child is unwell to attend school due to illness.

## If you drop your child at school:

- Entrance to the school begins at 7:30am.
- You must say goodbye to them at the classroom door so they can go ahead and settle into class, please don't stay too long its best they get into the routine and don't worry – they will be absolutely fine!
- Please allow extra time at the start of the school year to accommodate road works and increased traffic. Your children don't like to be late for school.

























# Collection Procedure

## If your child takes the bus:

- Your child will be taken to the bus by an adult.
- You must be at the collection point to meet your child at the allocated time.

## If you pick your child up from school:

- The collection point for Years 1-2 is at the classroom. One parent is allowed to drop off and pick up so the corridors and walkways don't get too full up. Signage will direct you to the allocated door for your child's class. Please do follow the one-way system.
- Please ensure the adult collecting your child has the 'safe word' (you will receive this in an email from your class teacher on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> August). This will be requested upon collection until you become known to your child's class teacher.

























# Thank you for being on time



- After the National Anthem the doors close at 7.50am. Anyone arriving after this time
  will be marked as late. In the unlikely case that you are late please head to main reception.
  Your child will be scanned in by a member of our admin team. Children don't like being late
  and we appreciate your support to ensure they are on time.
- Once school and learning has started, <u>parents are not able</u> to enter the corridors or classes.
- As per our GCS Behaviour Policy, punctuality is very important therefore if your child is late on 3 occasions throughout the term a member of the Senior Leadership Team will be in contact with you.

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




# Bring Your Own Device

- Your child must have a device with them every day.

  your PE lesson will be
























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# Snack & Lunch

- We are a healthy school and encourage healthy food to be consumed.

# Supporting your child at home

- Please read with your child every day in both your home language and English!
- Revisit learning from the week as guided by your child's class teacher.
- Real life experiences take children shopping and get them to pay using money,
   bake a cake allowing your child to measure the ingredients etc.
- Play board games, don't forget to teach your child about how to lose. They can't always be the winner at school!
- Teach them to be independent, by getting them to help out with household chores and being responsible for their belongings.

























# How GCS supports our parents

- Every Thursday afternoon, parents will receive a weekly email with information on what curriculum content has been covered and what your child will cover the following week.
- We would expect a minimum expectation of 20 minutes of reading per day.
- Homework will be assigned every Thursday and will be submitted to the class teacher every
  Tuesday. This will be acknowledged and returned to your child before they leave school on a
  Thursday.
- Every Tuesday afternoon there will be an opportunity for parents to meet virtually with their Class Teacher. This is an opportunity to discuss any concerns or ask any questions you may have. A Zoom link will be sent out to you each week.
- Our priority is the teaching and learning of your child however we will respond to your email within 24 hours. If your communication is urgent, please contact our reception team by telephone and they will be able to pass on the message.



















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# Text Books

- Your child will receive a textbook in the following subjects:
- Maths
- > English
- Science
- ➤ MoE
- Text books will need to be brought to school every Monday so that your child can access the learning materials. They will be returned home every Thursday. If these are not returned this will impact on your child's learning.
- If your child does not have their books on 3 occasions then your child's book must remain in school and not return home.
- If your child has lost their books then there will be an expectation that you pay for new books.
